

Towards a Networked Demography?

A case study of gender countercultures on Reddit

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Overview

We study five grassroots **gender countercultures on Reddit**.

We examine **genealogical ties, indexing ties, and algorithmic ties** between them.

We find:

- > indexing behaviors **correspond to shared history**
- > social identities **evolve in relation to each other**
- > potential for a **network approach** to social identity

“Conventional” Gender Model



According to this model, gender is:

- > binary
- > physiological
- > immutable¹

- > In the U.S., **a growing population identifies as transgender**¹.
- > **Social behaviors inconsistent with this model** have been documented and studied **as far back as the Roman empire**².
- > Because nearly all demographic research uses this model, **we do not have reliable data** on the life, health, and wellbeing of transgender people in the U.S.

I argue that this is a problem in **knowledge equity**.

- > Transgender people should have the same access to basic knowledge about themselves
- > Exclusion from scientific institutions creates an opportunity for mis- and disinformation to spread.

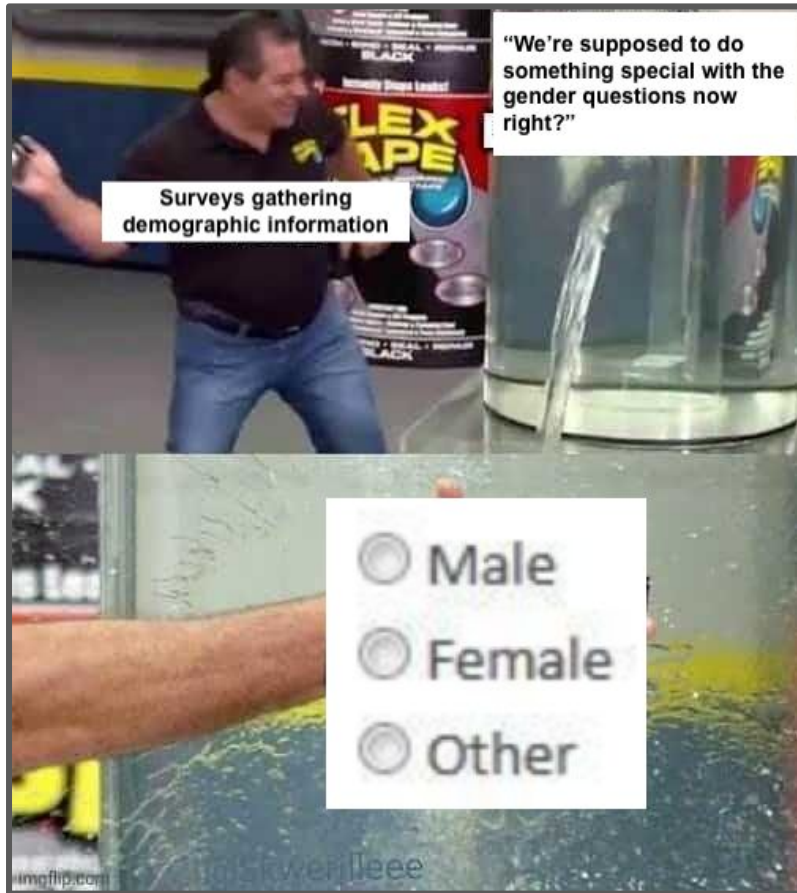

This is probably better than nothing BUT it also doesn’t address the actual problem.

- > The conventional model conflates physiological, biological, social, and cultural understandings of gender and sex.
 - There is **no consensus** on what differentiates sex category from gender category¹.
 - The conventional model is really a “folksonomy” of gender².
- > A person’s gender/sex category can change over time.
- > “M” and “F” can mean lots of different things depending on the person and the context.

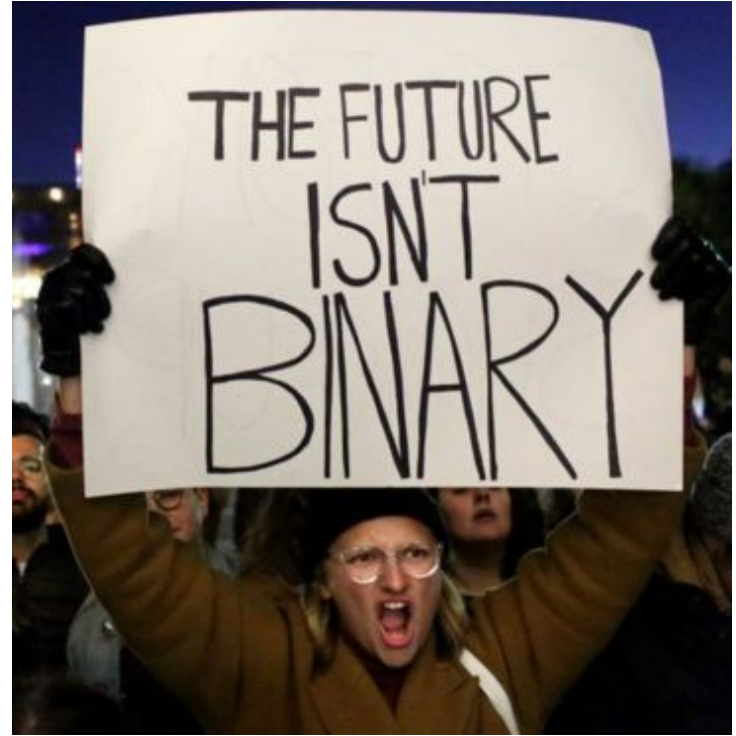


I argue that a trans-inclusive demography requires us to **change how we think about identity categories.**

Gender Countercultures

> crowd-driven communities that seek to **nuance, reshape, or reject** the conventional gender model.



Gender Countercultures on Reddit

Reddit has hosted a variety of gender countercultures and movements, such as:

- > The #MeToo Movement¹
- > Transgender and non-binary communities²
- > Masculinity, “geek culture,” and a sense of male marginalization³
- > The “Red Pill” and the “Manosphere”⁴

These countercultures are tied to conflicting gender *ontologies*.

Our Five Case Studies

From existing literature, we identified **five themes of gender countercultures on Reddit**:



- > The “Manosphere”¹
- > The “Red Pill”²
- > Misandry³
- > Feminism²
- > Gender minorities⁴

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Reddit as an Information Platform

Reddit is a social media platform organized by **subreddits**.

Subreddits serve as **social, informational, and cultural centers**.

Subreddits are interest-based. Users subscribe to the subreddits that interest them and see this content in their feed.

Community members called **moderators regulate subreddit content**.
Subreddits develop distinct cultures.

Reddit as a Networked Information Platform

Our Definition of a Multiplex Network



Genealogical ties: undirected, weighted shared moderator ties



Indexing ties: directed, binary ties parsed from hyperlinks in subreddit sidebars



Algorithmic ties: undirected, binary ties representing shared search keywords

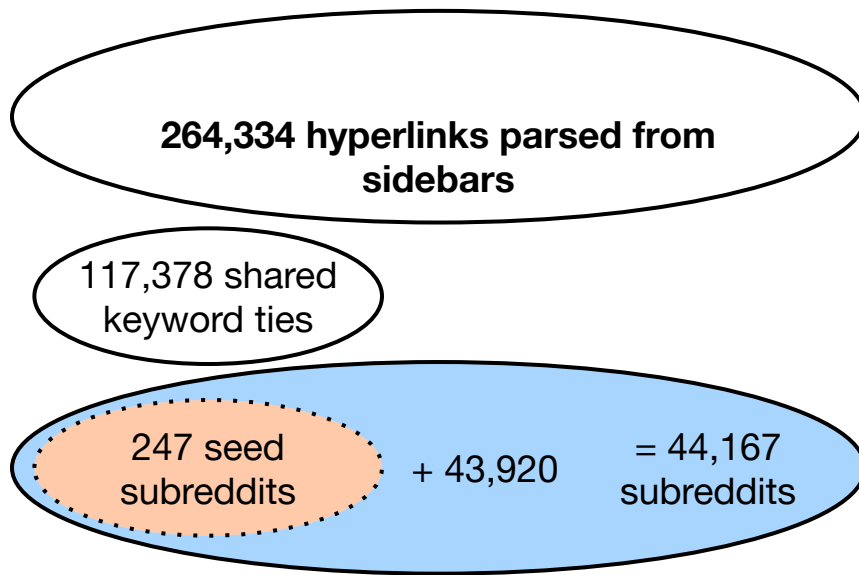
2. **Link tracing along hyperlink ties** until we reach a natural boundary.

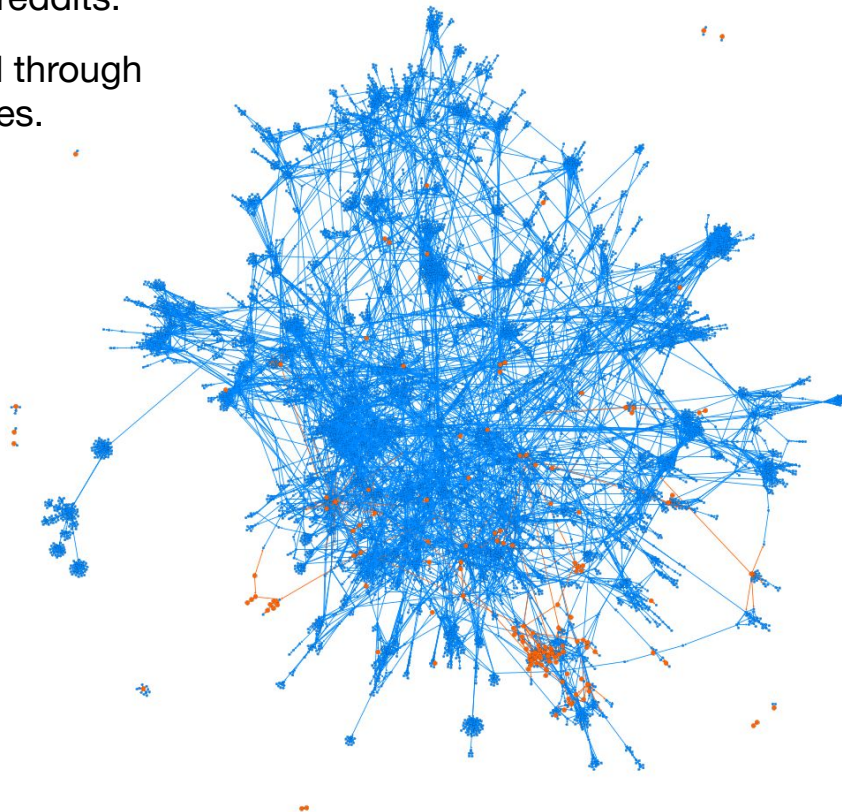

Blue nodes were discovered through link tracing along hyperlink ties.



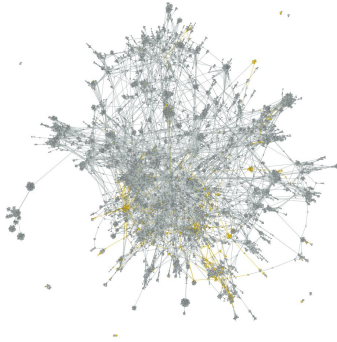
Countercultures in Hyperlink Network

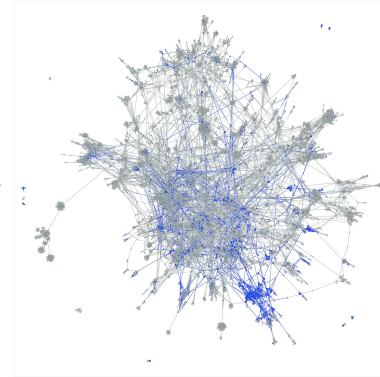

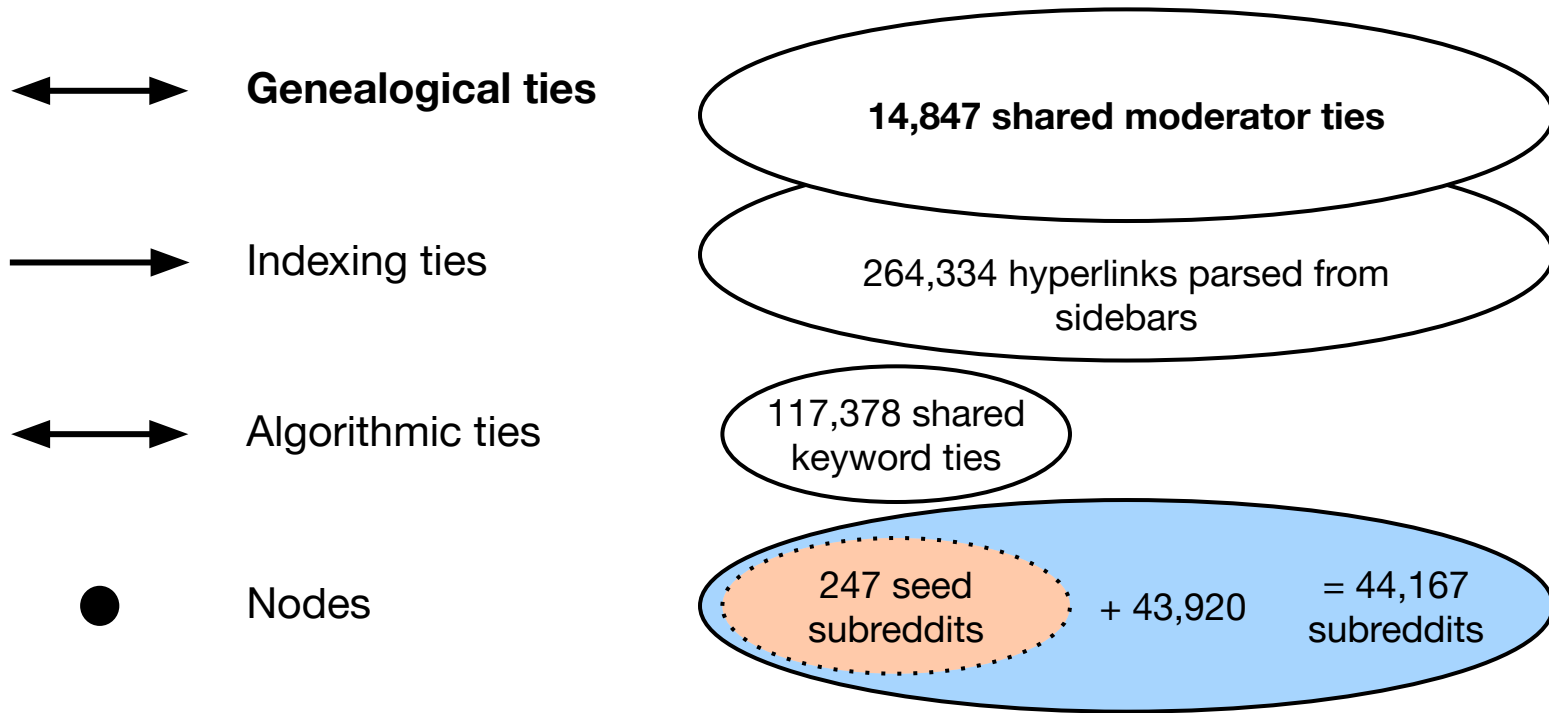

Discursive Themes in Shared Moderator Network



- > Shared moderator ties are undirected, weighted ties.
- > Colored nodes are seed subreddits belonging to each counter culture.

RQ 1: How do Reddit users organize social identities?

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Observations from the indexing (hyperlink) layer:

- > Edgewise reciprocity and transitivity were significantly *above* the baseline¹.
 - Counterculture subgraphs were cohesive at the dyadic and triadic scale.

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 - Counterculture subgraphs were fragmented at the macro scale.
- > Subreddit age is positively correlated with indegree: $\rho = 0.35$ ($p = 0$).
 - Older subreddits serve as reference points for newer subreddits.

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- > In indexing and genealogical layers, gender subreddits are embedded in a broader ecosystem of identity-based subreddits.
 - Gender can't be separated from other cultural dimensions.
- > In the conceptual layer, red pill and manosphere subreddits are at the core.
 - Red pill and manosphere subreddits are key sites of cultural production.

RQ 3: Do genealogical and algorithmic relationships align with crowd-assembled structures?

| Theme | Hyperlink Odds Given Shared Moderator Tie |
|-----------------|---|
| Manosphere | 8,200*** |
| Red Pill | 380*** |
| Misandry | 71*** |
| Feminism | 1,200*** |
| Gender Minority | 6,500* |

Observations:

> Odds of a hyperlink tie given a **shared moderator** tie are significantly *above* the baseline (compared to absence of the shared moderator tie)¹.

RQ 3: Do genealogical and algorithmic relationships align with crowd-assembled structures?

| Theme | Hyperlink Odds Given Shared Keyword Tie |
|-----------------|---|
| Manosphere | 1.2*** |
| Red Pill | 1.2*** |
| Misandry | 1.1*** |
| Feminism | 1.2*** |
| Gender Minority | 1.3*** |

Observations:

> Odds of a hyperlink tie given a **shared keyword** tie are significantly *above* the baseline (compared to absence of the shared keyword tie)¹.

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Future work will examine how we can use networks to overcome the limits of “flat” gender categories.
